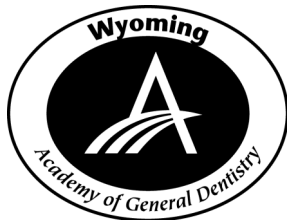

HIV and Hepatitis A-E: What Oral Health Care Providers Should Know

Among the emerging diseases of concern to dental care providers are HIV disease and the hepatitis viruses. As the incidence of these viral infections increases, more patients infected with HIV and hepatitis will seek dental care. The pathogenesis, epidemiology, management of oral manifestations of HIV and the medical management of HIV disease and hepatitis A-E will be presented. Dental management of patients infected with these diseases will be explained with emphasis on proper diagnosis, treatment planning, and interpretation of serologic and other blood tests necessary to properly manage these patients. Dental concerns regarding occupational exposure and infection control will also be addressed.

Topics will include:

- A review of HIV infection and the oral manifestations of HIV disease.
- A review of hepatitis A-E with empathizes on hepatitis C.
- Medical management of these diseases.
- Blood test indications and interpretation
- Dental management of patients with HIV and hepatitis infection.

- Learn the various types and routes of transmission, pathogenesis and management of HIV disease and viral hepatitis with empathize on hepatitis C.
- Recognize the oral manifestations of HIV disease.
